Jewish National Fund's Hula Lake Nature and Bird Park is located along a major global migration route. Every year during spring and fall migration, 500 million birds fly to the Hula Valley. Developed by KKL-JNF as part of the Hula Valley Rehabilitation Plan, the park has become a world renowned attraction for hundreds of thousands of visitors each year from Israel and abroad and serves as a model for cooperation between conservationists, birders, tourists and farmers.

Through your support, KKL-JNF

is establishing a 4,000 square meter state-of-the-art visitor center at this unique site. The Centre is at the heart of the Hula Valley's vital wetland rehabilitation project. The centre will be a world-class scientific and educational facility, designed to blend with its environment according to principles of sustainable development. It will link Israel with scientific communities and travelers from around the world. The site is expected to attract one million local and international tourists annually, more than doubling the current number,

within 10 years.

JNF Toronto will help transform a vision into a reality. The Stephen J. Harper Hula Valley Bird Sanctuary Visitor & Education Centre will benefit the environment and become a major source of income for the residents of the area. With your help, the visitor and education centre will become the pinnacle of KKL-JNF's major project, restoring the Hula wetlands to their former glory.

organization. It is through the efforts of our lay leaders that we are able to provide for the needs of our community.



ISRAEL'S "BIRD MAN" VISITS WINNIPEG



On the beautiful, sunny Canada Day long weekend, the Jewish National Fund – Manitoba/Saskatchewan Region had the pleasure of hosting Dr. Yossi Leshem, a renowned ornithologist from Israel and his wife Rivka as they completed the last stop on their Canadian tour. Dr. Leshem was invited to visit Winnipeg by the JNF and The Honourable Christine Melnick, Minister of Immigration and Multiculturalism. Together with Minister Melnick, Past Regional Board President, Mel Lazareck, a representative from Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre, Pamela Wankling and Rob Berkowitz organized the Leshems' visit.

Israel is located at the junction of three continents – Europe, Asia, and Africa. This section of the Middle East forms the northern start of the Great Rift Valley, which provides a corridor through which over 500 million birds migrate every year. This area has provided the opportunity for a unique partnership between Dr. Leshem, an Israeli Jew, and Palestinian and Jordanian Arabs. This partnership, which is 20 years strong, has been named “Birding as a Path to Peace” and has grown to include a large educational component through which Arab and Jewish children come

together on the subject of bird watching and identification in over 250 schools throughout the State of Israel.

“So often when we hear stories about the Middle East, the prospect of hope is left out,” says Karla Berbrayer, Regional Board President of the Jewish National Fund “Dr. Leshem shows us that environmental conservation and the study of birds can bring Arabs and Jews together. If partnership can be developed around birds, then peace in the Middle East may be possible.”

Bringing Dr. Leshem to Winnipeg is a joint effort between the Jewish National Fund and Oak Hammock Marsh, which is a sister marsh to the Hula Valley wetland in Israel.

When the Leshems first arrived in Winnipeg, their first stop was at the CTV studios downtown to tape a segment for CTV Morning Live. That evening, they enjoyed a lovely Shabbat dinner at Shaarey Zedek Synagogue, and impressed guests with their stories of travelling, presenting and of course, birding!

The weekend was filled with various media appearances and interviews, well-attended presentations at both Fort Whyte Alive and Oak Hammock Marsh

Interpretive Centre (a sister marsh to the Hula Valley wetland) and trips to local attractions such as the Winnipeg Art Gallery and Lower Fort Garry.

Back home in Israel, Dr. Leshem has been involved in many aspects of nature conservation, with an emphasis on bird research for 38 years. Since 1984, research for his doctorate has resulted in a decrease of 76% of collisions with aircraft caused by birds, and has saved \$790 million, not to mention many lives, both human and avian. Today he serves as Lt. Col. (Ret) in the Israeli Air Force and continues this research.

At the moment, Dr. Leshem is conducting a number of scientific projects, among them a project which tracks migrating birds that have been fitted with satellite transmitters, and a project that tracks migration with the aid of radar, in cooperation with a team of scientists. Dr. Leshem has also initiated a program to use Barn Owls and Kestrels as pest controllers to reduce the use of pesticides in agricultural fields, which became a national program and a regional project with Jordan and the Palestinian Authority.





"I want to thank the people who donated these scholarships, which mean much more to us than just money. This is a gift of a warm and loving embrace." Olga's husband Kfir was one of 44 people, most of them IPS cadets, who were killed in the December 2010 Carmel Forest fire. The scholarships for the new school year were the gift of the Correctional Officers Ride Fund (COR), through JNF To-

ronto and the Maurice OBM and Laura Simons Fund of England.

KKL-JNF Director General Meir Shpigler said that besides its commitment to a greener, more sustainable environment, "KKL-JNF puts education at the top of its priority list. We have five educational centres throughout the country where students come and learn about KKL-JNF activities and values. Together with Laura Simons and the Correctional Officers Ride Fund of Toronto, KKL-JNF is honoured to support the IPS orphans."

The members of the Hard Chargers

Motorcycle Club from Toronto couldn't be at the ceremony, but they prepared a video clip for the IPS families. Being correctional officers themselves, they were very affected by the Carmel fire and wanted to help the families of those affected by the tragedy.

Lieutenant General Aharon Franco, commander of the Israel Prison Service, said, "KKL-JNF and its friends everywhere in the world are a synonym for accomplishing things and finding creative ways to support and to help. The solidarity expressed by the Canadian correctional officers is very moving."

JNF OTTAWA PROJECT: YIR'ON RECYCLED WATER RESERVOIR

OUR HONOUREE'S GOT HEART JNF OTTAWA NEGEV DINNER OCTOBER 29, 2013



At this year's Negev Dinner, JNF Ottawa will be honouring Dr. Robert Roberts, President and CEO of the University of Ottawa Heart Institute(UOHI) and the founding Director of The Ruddy Canadian Cardiovascular Genetics Centre. As one of the founders of molecular

cardiology, Dr. Roberts is recognized as a leader in the research and practice of cardiology worldwide. He is 100% committed to the dinner. Says Dr. Roberts, "When I was approached to be the Negev Dinner 2013 Honouree, I immediately saw this as a great opportunity on my part and on behalf of the Heart Institute to say thank you, and in a very small way give back to the community."

Dr. Roberts has chosen a water project to support for this year's Ottawa Negev Dinner Campaign, because according to him "it is very likely that the 21st century will be more about water than oil. There is an increasing concern around the world as to whether or not we will have adequate water for all and also if we will be able to adequately protect water against all contaminants. Clean

water remains fundamental, it is fundamental to life, and for me it was an obvious project to select."

Dinner proceeds will be directed to the Yir'on Recycled Water Reservoir, a 40,000cm reservoir used to irrigate fruit orchards in the Upper East Galilee. The reservoir provides a readily available source of irrigation water for Galilee farmers, improves the water situation in Israel and provides a solution for an ecologically hazardous situation by recycling effluents instead of letting them flow untreated. Recycled wastewater from JNF reservoirs now supplies 50% of the demand for agricultural water in Israel, and every new reservoir built raises this number higher!



WHERE TO NEXT IN THE MIDDLE EAST?

Our Negev Dinner guest speaker, Bret Stephens, won the 2013 Pulitzer Prize for Commentary and is the foreign affairs columnist of The Wall Street Journal, as well as the deputy editor responsible for the editorial pages of the Wall Street Journal Asia and Europe. He is a member of the paper's editorial board and a regular panelist on The Journal Editorial Report, a weekly political talk show carried nationally by the Fox News Channel.

Mr. Stephens is the former editor-in-chief of The Jerusalem Post, a position he assumed at the age of 28. At the Post, he was responsible for its news, editorial, digital and international editions. He will provide an in-depth perspective on the Middle East and Israel's position having had the exposure to world leaders, including Benazir Bhutto, Tony Blair, George W. Bush, Vaclav Havel and every Israeli Prime Minister since Shimon Peres.



The Arava is simply inhospitable to traditional farming because an annual rainfall of barely 50 mm renders the soil unusable. However, thanks to Israeli resourcefulness spearheaded by the JNF, the arid region astonishingly still produces nearly 60% of the total Israeli export of fresh vegetables and roughly 15% of its high-end aquarium fish and decorative flower exports.

In her closing remarks, JNF Montreal President Barbara Maldoff proudly announced that the prominent accounting firm RSM Richter has agreed to be Montreal’s 2014 Negev Evening Honouree.

JNF Montreal celebrated the 25th anniversary of its annual Tu B'Shevat Tree-A-Thon last February by raising nearly \$150,000 worth of trees. The event was planned in collaboration with JNF Montreal's Student Council, which helped ensure a remarkable turnout of over 100 student volunteers from high schools, CEGEPs and universities.

"The event was a fun experience for our volunteers," explained Tree-A-Thon co-chair and past student volunteer, Stu Guttman. "Big-hearted supporters in the community always donate great food

Trees purchased from this event were planted in the Kissufim Forest, an area located a short distance from the Gaza border, which was severely damaged in the 2012 conflict with Hamas.

The project's main goal? Encouraging local residents — who have been traumatized by rockets—to appreciate the outdoors once again. In addition to providing pleasant scenery and shade, trees were planted in special security formations designed to block a terrorist's field of vision.



PLAN A GIFT TO JNF AND DO YOUR ESTATE A FAVOUR

The Jewish National Fund is well known for its ability to think long term about programs that make lasting contributions to the development of the State of Israel and its natural environment. JNF supporters would do well to adopt this type of long term thinking in planning their participation in such projects. This is especially true as gifts made through one's will can often be much higher than one could give in one's lifetime. And in doing so, one not only acts as an example to future generations but also generates tax credits which can be of some use to one's estate in distributing assets to heirs.

In Canada, we tax most assets on the value they gain during the time they were owned. (The biggest exception to this rule is the individual's principal residence). Generally speaking on the death of the second spouse, there is a large tax liability owing because of the general appreciation in value of most assets. This rule applies equally to items like a family cottage or investment properties. Often, heirs are forced to sell the asset they most desire to keep just to pay the taxes owing on the property.

Tax credits, on the other hand, reduce

tax owing. Gifts to a registered charity can create these credits and when gifts are made in a will the tax credits can be used against the tax owing on assets which might otherwise have to be sold to pay the tax. For this reason alone, Canadians should think carefully about donating assets to a registered charity just to create the tax credits to keep more valued assets in the family. (For example, one may donate an investment property to charity in order to reduce the taxes owing on the family cottage). And, if the gift creates more tax credits than needed, unused tax credits can be carried back to offset taxes owed from the previous year.

Another way to create a fund of money which can be donated to charity is through the use of life insurance. Generous donors who wish to donate a large sum of money may not have the total amount of funds to cover the bequest they have in mind. One way to supplement these funds is to take out a life insurance policy for the benefit of the JNF. Once the policy is donated to the JNF the premiums can also be donated to the charity so that a tax receipt can be issued both upon the donation of the policy and

the yearly donation of the premium. When the policy matures the amount of the payment will be paid directly to the JNF and then used for whichever purposes have been previously discussed.

Almost any capital asset can be donated. This can be a home, other real estate, RRSPs, collectibles, or premium points. However, the tax benefits of making such donations after death are only realized if the gift is included in the donor's will. It is therefore prudent to plan ahead by retaining a lawyer when drafting the will. And of course the JNF staff should be consulted to ensure that the gift in mind is enough to fund the objects one has in mind. Leaving a sizeable gift by will to the JNF can be a wonderful way to be memorialized for future generations and remind ones children about the important things in life.
